I am writing this letter of support for the Audiology & Speech-Language Pathology Interstate Compact (ASLP-IC). This compact will allow licensed audiologists and speech-language pathologists to obtain a privilege to practice across state lines. It will permit audiologists and speech-language pathologists to provide services to underserved or geographically isolated populations through telepractice and facilitate continuity of care when patients, clients, and/or students relocate or travel to another compact state. The compact will increase access to care and improve consumer protections.

The ASLP-IC will improve consumer protections across state lines; increase access to care for patients, clients, and students; promote cooperation between ASLP-IC member states; facilitate greater investigatory resources for state regulatory boards; provide support for relocating military spouses; and permit practitioners to provide service to underserved or geographically isolated populations through telepractice.

We live in a rural area and many of our clients live across state lines or at a great distance from campus. We fully support this proposal.
